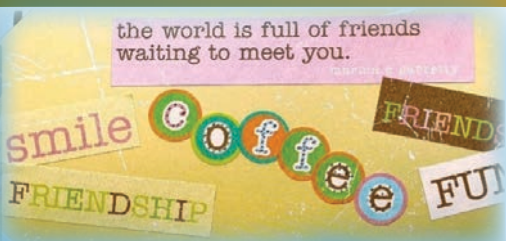

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WYNYARD'S YOUTH COUNCIL

I recently had the opportunity to meet three of the Youth Council's new members, each accompanied by a parent, and Val Bailey of Wynyard Parish Council (Stockton). I wanted to hear what they had to say and observe their approach to taking up this role at their first Youth Council meeting on 15th September and beyond.

I'd like to say straight off that I was immensely impressed with their enthusiasm, their ideas and ability to articulate them and their determination to make Wynyard a better place for young people to enjoy. We adults often say what a lovely place it is to live but that also needs to be the case for the younger residents who want and deserve to have a thriving community life here too. They represent the whole of Wynyard.

It was also great to see the support from the parents and the parish council reflected in Val's commitment to this initiative.



Ben, Thomas and Mia, photographed above wearing their Youth Council lanyards, spoke about their ideas. Mia suggested that the children could create a garden to meet and chat in. Ben was keen on more events and activities for children at Wynyard such as tennis court(s) and a MUGA (Multi Use Games Area) which can also be enjoyed by adults and Thomas said that Wynyard is a good place to live but most of the time they have to travel at least 20 minutes to go to fun places like sports centres, trampoline parks, the cinema or swimming pool. All 3 said that they wanted to create ways for children at Wynyard who attend a variety of schools to get to know each other better and make their and their parents lives better.

Val explained how the Youth Council meetings would precede that of the adult council each month which has allocated a £10,000 budget to the Youth Council to finance the development of ideas and any trips. At their first meeting they will elect a chairperson who will present a report on behalf of the youth council to the adult council after each meeting. There will also need to be a member responsible for the budget and expenditure. The meetings will also need to be minuted by the Secretary to the youth council so that is another role. The youth council will also provide an update in the Wynyard Matters magazine.

Val further explained that individuals in finance, strategy and public speaking will come and talk to them to equip them for their roles. It is hoped that the MPs for Stockton North, Chris McDonald and for Hartlepool, Jonathan Brash will attend their first meeting. It is also understood that Mark Antonopoulos of Cameron Hall Developments is supportive and willing to meet them. Local businesses may be contacted to provide support too.

Ben, Mia and Thomas are also keen on helping at community events and supporting charities, so we talked about the forthcoming scarecrow trail in October to be put on by the Wynyard Matters Events team. Thomas mentioned that he is involved in a bake sale for charity so the youth council could contribute to the bake sale at the scarecrow trail. They spoke about the importance of a senior school at Wynyard and Val said how powerful their voices would be at planning committees.

I so enjoyed the energy expressed by Mia who was a school councillor in year 5 and likes public speaking, Ben who over the breakfast table at home had come up with several ideas when he saw the article about the Youth Council in Wynyard Matters and Thomas who clearly recognised the responsibility of these roles.

I asked their parents what they thought and it was evident that they saw this as a great opportunity for their children to address issues which are important for their generation and also Wynyard's wider community and to learn how to get things done which involve managing expenditure, communication, due process and caring for their environment and the people in it.

In summary, I believe that the Youth Council of Wynyard will be a great asset to Wynyard which, along with the WRA and the 2 parish councils will represent the entire community, and working together, will enhance the present and the future.

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A BRIDGE ACROSS MINDS

I was privileged to meet Dr Helen Haynes, a Wynyard resident and local Consultant Psychiatrist to talk about her book which is being launched in September.

C: Hi Helen, it's lovely to meet you. Tell me a bit about yourself.

H: My husband, who is a police officer, and I moved to Wynyard 4 years ago with our twin sons who are now 11 years of age. We love living here and exploring the area at the weekends as a family with our dog who is now 14. As a psychiatrist my focus is on older people of aged 65 and over who are often overlooked regarding their mental health. In my view, they are 65 years + young, not old. My areas of interest include depression, delirium, dementia and brain injury. I am the Dementia and Delirium Pathway Lead for my Trust and a passionate advocate for Old Age Psychiatry.

C: What made you decide to write a book?

H: When I was Educational Lead and providing training there was nothing out there relating to older people's mental health other than textbook based information and I felt there was a lack of empathy and attempt to put oneself in the shoes of the patient.

C: Could you expand on this?

H: There is great access to the NHS for older people in this locality with established links to charitable organisations in this area and new advances all the time in disease modifying medication which is great of course. I wanted to really look at the experience of mental unwellness and lift up hope. Anyone can be a patient from any walk of life, and it is important to challenge our previous perceptions of mental health. There are building blocks in life which make up the story of a person's life which can lead to mental ill health. I don't want the older generation to feel written off. I want them to recognise that they still have a life to lead, hopes and enjoyment and that they don't have to just accept symptoms like memory changes amongst others as normal as you get older. It's also not right to just accept loneliness or grief and be told "what do you expect?"

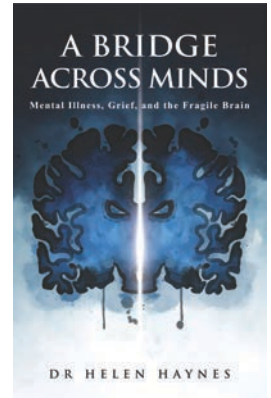
C: How do you convey all this in your book?

H: The setting of my book is that of a Consultant Psychiatrist treating another Consultant Psychiatrist, Dr Elaine Patch, aged 65, who suffers acute stress and severe depression following the death of her husband. I look at it from both perspectives from within an NHS psychiatric hospital. I hope I offer insights into grief, recovery and mental illness.

C: I have read your final proof and think it is so evocatively written. Your depiction of scenes sounds and sensations really take you inside the mind. You talk about those "whose minds have turned against them" and that "somewhere in the mind the software is corrupted, the hardware appears fine". You refer to the "unspoken crack in the facade, the pain you cannot point to on an x-ray". Dr Patch remembers how, before, she could "wrap agony in clinical terms".

You use the phrase 65 years young, and as such a person myself, I also value your message that becoming older does not diminish the human desire for independence purpose and fulfilment and to remain oneself.

You also talk about brain injury and how you describe the areas of the brain is fascinating. You say, "These regions are vast and delicate networks, but each leaves a unique signature when it fails". You explain different diagnoses and the journey towards and beyond them. The various characters in your book display



these conditions in a way that gives the reader a flash of insight into their minds. As Dr Patch is treated, she starts to realise that "she can have a thought without it tangling immediately into ten others". She has also observed how others on the ward are improving "building a bridge into their future". This is also open to her. Small things begin to matter again. She visits her home she shared with her husband and acknowledges the changes which have quietly returned to her life such as "a laugh that surprises me, a memory that soothes". She is discharged and walks away with "my head held high and my heart lighter".

How would you summarise your aim in writing this book?

H: I hope to break down the stigma of mental health and advocate for the older population and offer compassion, hope and understanding. People are living longer and need to be recognised as still valuable members of society with lives to live and enjoy. The book will be launched on 10th September which is World Suicide Prevention Day. It is also being recorded as an e- book.

C: It's been incredibly interesting talking to you, Helen, and reading your book which is so much more than I have précised above. It has opened my eyes enormously and I am encouraged by your vision and strength of purpose. Thank you for talking to me.

H: Thanks Caroline. I will be donating a copy of my book to our community's book hut, so it is available there for anyone who wants to read it. Otherwise, it will be found on amazon once published.

PUMPKIN SPICED CUPCAKES



Ingredients

For the sponge:

- 140g butter softened
- 120g golden caster sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 140g self-raising flour
- 2 tbsp pumpkin spice mixture
- 2-3 tbsp milk plus extra for the icing if needed

For the icing:

- 100g unsalted butter softened
- 100g icing sugar sieved
- ½ tbsp pumpkin spice mixture
- 200g full-fat soft cheese

Method

Heat the oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Line a 12-hole muffin tin with cupcake cases. Beat the butter and sugar together using an electric whisk until the mixture is light and fluffy, scraping down the edges to combine. Gradually beat in the eggs and vanilla.

Fold in the flour and pumpkin spice, followed by the milk, and combine until you have a smooth batter. Using a tablespoon, divide the mixture between the cupcake cases, around two-thirds full. Bake for 12-15 mins – they should be firm to the touch and slightly golden brown. Cool in the tin for 5 mins, then lift them out gently onto a wire rack and leave to cool completely.

Spanning generations and genders, we have discovered so much to talk about and learn from each other. Some who come are in their 40s all the way through to those in their 80s and we even have a lovely gentleman in his 90s! Difference in age is no barrier to the lively conversation.

"The coffee group has made such a difference to my life."

"It has made a massive difference to me. There was a void in my life, and it has given me a reason to get up every morning and a purpose. I look forward to it every day."

"The coffee group is such fun; we always laugh and joke which is just the best medicine!"

"The coffee mornings are wonderful! Something to look forward to, meeting really good, friendly people. It suits me how many times I want to go, so easy, I really, really enjoy it!"

Try it out and even if you are shy or reticent to start with, everyone understands and will be alongside you. A natter over a brew, often with laughter, is great way to start your day!

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WHEN IT COMES TO SPEED, 40 IS NOT THE NEW 30!



Did you get caught speeding recently? I did. I was caught doing 34mph in a 30mph zone in Spennymoor. I had every excuse in the world - I was running late, I was worried about my elderly father, I was listening to the radio. The point is that I had lost focus. I had forgotten that a car is an extremely dangerous machine if the driver is not concentrating and careful of others safety and indeed his/her own.

I was offered the speed awareness course, and I am so glad I did it as it taught me a vital lesson which is **SPEED KILLS**. I learnt that just a small increase in speed can negatively affect the outcome of an accident. Examples of data from traffic safety research are

- 23mph – 10% risk of death and 25% risk of severe injury
- 31-33 mph - 50% risk of death and 50% risk of severe injury
- 46-58mph – Risk of death climbs rapidly to 90%
- Age is a massive compounding factor. Elderly pedestrians have a much greater risk of suffering fatal injuries than other age
- On average, in frontal impacts, belted drivers have a 17 per cent risk of being fatally injured in impacts at 40mph and a 60 per cent risk at 50mph. Although, half of drivers who were fatally injured were in an impact of 34mph or less.

Worrying then that along the Wynd we have cars travelling regularly at 40mph and over, even 50mph, 55mph and 61mph! What about the children, the dogwalkers, the joggers, anyone enjoying being outside?

The Wynd is what it says on the label - a winding road, through a housing estate with several crossways where the pavement stops and continues on the other side of the road. These crossways are not marked and are often hidden by bends, slopes and foliage. Cars travelling at excessive speeds have very little chance of stopping at short notice.

It's why a road like the Wynd has a legal speed limit of 30mph.

I am aware of the speed bumps and chicanes that were deemed necessary and later removed. My campaign is not to replace these but to make all users of the Wynd aware of and adhere to the speed limit. The 2 digital signs already in place are not having the desired effect. Indeed, one of them is currently obscured by tree branches and is hard to see on bright sunny days.

So, as a starter, we need more and better signage along the Wynd to increase drivers' awareness and focus on their speed. I believe that for many that is all it will take to keep their foot off the accelerator. In addition, I am communicating with Cleveland Community Police Officers and Stockton Highways Transport and Design Department to set a date for a community speed watch. If you would like to be involved in this, **please contact me at the email address below.**

I am receiving a lot of emails and letters of support from residents who live on the Wynd and beyond who, like me are very concerned that if nothing is done there will be a tragic accident that should have been averted.

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WHAT'S THE LATEST AT ROSEBERRY PLACE?

Although the new Coop has now opened, I was curious as to the progress of the rest of the development at Roseberry Place so asked Matt Johnson, Wynyard Park's Development Director, a few questions:



How close to completion and opening are the units at Roseberry Place aside from the Coop?

Roseberry Place is progressing well, with several units now open and others in the final stages of preparation.

Alongside the recently opened Co-op, both Shape Studios, a premium Reformer Pilates studio, and Sun Tanning Co. are now operational, providing residents with convenient, high-quality wellness and lifestyle services at the heart of the development.

Head Quarters (HQ) Barbers has also completed its lease and commenced its fit-out ahead of its opening. The award-winning North East grooming brand selected Roseberry Place for its sixth regional location and first within a luxury residential village, reflecting the strength of the Wynyard Park community and the appeal of the development.



These openings represent important milestones for Roseberry Place, which has been designed to provide a high-quality, community-focused mix of retail, leisure and service businesses for residents and visitors alike. The development comprises nine retail units and, once fully occupied, is expected to support more than 30 permanent jobs.

Demand for the remaining units has been encouraging, with further tenant announcements expected as Roseberry Place continues to evolve into the commercial heart of Wynyard Park.

What will be coming to the currently empty units if known?

While we are unable to share specific details at this stage, plans for both the restaurant and wine bar are progressing well, with designs and final proposals currently being developed.

These will be exciting additions to Roseberry Place, further broadening the range of amenities available to residents and visitors. Together with the businesses already open and those due to launch soon, they will help reinforce Wynyard Park's position as a thriving, well-rounded lifestyle destination, where people can access high-quality retail, dining, wellbeing and everyday services within the heart of the community.

Has there been any feedback regarding the new Coop so far?

The response has been extremely positive. We've had great feedback from both Co-op and the local community, particularly around the quality of the building and the convenience it brings to residents.

Co-op has described the store as "a showpiece in the Co-op store estate," which is a fantastic endorsement of both the design and the quality of the development. Residents have also highlighted how much easier day-to-day life has become, with comments such as: "It makes such a difference now that I can pop into the new Co-op and pick up everything I need conveniently - a real gamechanger."

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DO YOU KNOW WHERE IT IS AND HOW TO USE IT?

I don't know about you, but I have no idea how to actually use a defibrillator and even though voice instructions are given at the time it is needed, I am really not sure I would be able to follow them in a crisis trying to save someone's life.

I have just undergone retraining in CPR -which you may have done or decide to do - but the defibrillator is the final recourse, and I should know what to expect if I had to use one.

Also, do you know that there are 2 defibrillators on Wynyard? One is at the East gate and the other is attached to the wall at the side of Wynyard Therapy at the shops in the village as you can see from the photos above.



I thought it would be useful for all residents to have at least a good idea of what to do if someone is in cardiac arrest so that there is familiarity with the process and we are better disposed to following the instructions in this situation which may be sudden and overwhelming.

I looked into the British Heart Foundation's advice and that of the St. John's Ambulance and found out the following:

- A defibrillator is a device that gives a jolt of energy to the heart. It helps get the heart beating again when someone is in cardiac arrest and their heart has stopped.
- If someone has stopped breathing or is not breathing normally, is unresponsive, there are no signs of movement or life and appears to be in cardiac arrest, call 999 and ask for an ambulance. The call handler will talk you through how to do chest compressions and rescue breaths. If you're on your own, do not interrupt CPR to go and find a defibrillator. If it's possible, send out someone else to find one. You now know where they are at Wynyard.
- The device checks the person's heart rhythm and will only tell you to give them a shock if it's needed. You cannot shock yourself or someone else accidentally.
- **Step 1:** Press the green button to switch on the defibrillator and follow the instructions.
- **Step 2:** Remove the person's clothing above the waist. Most defibrillator packs have tools like scissors to help you to do this. Also wipe away any sweat. It might feel odd or embarrassing but do not let that stop you. Remember, this is a life-or-death situation.
- **Step 3:** Peel off the sticky pads and attach them to the person's bare skin. Put one pad on each side of the chest as shown in the picture on the defibrillator.
- **Step 4:** Once you have attached the pads, stop CPR and do not touch the person. The defibrillator will then check the person's heart rhythm.

- **Step 5:** The defibrillator will decide whether a shock is needed. If so, it will tell you to press the 'shock' button. An automatic defibrillator will shock the person without you needing to do anything. Do not touch the person while they're being shocked.
- **Step 6:** The defibrillator will tell you when the shock has been given and whether you need to continue CPR.
- **Step 7:** If the defibrillator tells you to continue to do CPR, continue with chest compressions until the person shows signs of life, or the defibrillator tells you to stop so it can analyse the heartbeat again and provide further instruction.
- If the person shows signs of becoming responsive such as coughing, opening their eyes, speaking, or starting to breathe normally, put them in the recovery position.
- Leave the defibrillator attached. Monitor their level of response and prepare to give CPR again if necessary. Stay with the person until the ambulance arrives and the paramedics take over.

Do consider taking a course in CPR as this is a vital part of the lifesaving process together with the defibrillator.

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Wynyard Parish Council (Stockton) Update

Since the last edition of this magazine, we have welcomed Mark Doherty to fill one of our vacancies. Mark brings extensive professional experience in the field of civil engineering, as well as involvement with a local Rotary Club. Mark has already brought his skills to the fore in taking over the Council's dealings with Bellway regarding adoption - more detail on that below. We still have one vacancy remaining. Any interested applicants should contact our Parish Clerk, Barry Flux, via clerk@wynyardparishcouncil.gov.uk.

Wynyard Estate Services

In previous articles I have mentioned a strong desire for the Council to re-establish a working relationship with WES. After a lot of hard work behind the scenes, I am delighted to report that Councillors had a very productive meeting in late June with Mark Antonopoulos at Wynyard Hall.

The result of this is that from September the Council will be returning to Wynyard Hall for our monthly meetings (both full Council and Youth Council). Additionally, we will be holding quarterly in-person meetings with Mark, joined by colleagues from WPC(H). This will provide a formal, minuted, route for us to raise questions, issues and concerns directly with WES. The first of these meetings will be held in late August and include a walk around of the Community Centre currently under construction.

Stockton Borough Council Local Plan

SBC recently announced a timetable for the production of a new Local Plan, to take effect from 2029. Local Plans are of critical importance when it comes to the medium and long-term impacts to Wynyard in terms of further development (be that commercial, residential or infrastructure projects). There will be multiple opportunities for feedback and views to be filtered into the process of the plan being drawn up - the first of which will be in October.

The Council are committed to ensuring that we have a seat at the SBC table when these discussions are taking place and making sure that the voices of Wynyard residents are heard by those decision makers. Further information will be circulated in due course around how residents can feed their views to both us and SBC. I'd urge everyone to take part in any consultation exercises that might take place.

A689 Crossing

The Council is acutely aware that this is an issue of paramount importance to many residents and that it has been ongoing for many years. The most immensely frustrating element of this saga from a Council perspective is that it has been very difficult indeed to obtain straight forward answers on the responsibility for delivering this crossing, progress updates on project planning and clarification on funding status. After recent communications from both SBC and Ben Houchen, we reached out to both of our local MPs, Chris McDonald and Jonathan Brash, to express our dissatisfaction with the current situation and continued lack of progress.

In early July, alongside colleagues from WPC(H), we met with Chris and Jonathan at the site of the proposed crossing and sought their support for finally bringing this issue to a close. Soon after that meeting took place, a further planning application for 235 houses on the Wynyard Park development was approved at SBC Planning Committee, with no mention at all of a need for a pedestrian crossing. As a result of that meeting, the Council spoke with Jonathan Brash's office again and they have agreed to arrange a meeting in September with all parties together - SBC, Wynyard Park, both MPs, the TVCA and any other relevant stakeholders to hold everyone to account and demand a solution.

Bellway/Avant adoption

The adoption of the early phases of these two developments is something regarding which the Council receives a lot of correspondence from residents. Bellway in particular is a topic that we have been actively pursuing for quite some time. Since the early part of 2026, we have been chasing answers to a number of outstanding questions and have been escalating these up through the chain to regional and head office level, without much success.

As mentioned in the introduction, Councillor Doherty has taken over this issue on behalf of the Council and has made further attempts to contact both Bellway and SBC. A recent reply received from SBC indicated that Phases 1 and 2 were going through the legal process for adoption currently, which is positive news. SBC further advised that Bellway Homes have undertaken remedial works to many areas within the development to the satisfaction of SBC, however there is no fixed timescale for these remedial works to be fully completed. We will continue to push hard to ensure this happens as fast as possible.

In terms of Avant, similar concerns have been raised, and we have been in communication directly with the developer to check on the progress of things here. We are waiting a full reply to our specific list of questions and will communicate a further update in the next issue.

Issues with HGV Drivers

In mid July it was brought to the Council's attention that there were ongoing issues with the behaviour of HGV drivers in the vicinity of Glenarm Road. HGV drivers have been using this area as a rest stop, both during the day and overnight. The Council has been informed that drivers, particularly those delivering to the nearby Amazon hub, have been leaving an enormous amount of rubbish, as well as human waste on the roads and pavements in this area. As well as being totally unacceptable, the area in question leads to the children's kick about green space, which raises particular concerns for the public health of children, their parents and domestic pets.

The Council made immediate contact with Amazon, SBC's Environmental Health team and Chris McDonald. Amazon have lodged this as an official complaint and have raised the possibility of using GPS monitoring to ensure that their trucks do not stop in this area. SBC's EH team have asked for photographic evidence to be supplied to them in order to help build a specific case - residents can email any photos or details to me via robinwoolley@wynyardparishcouncil.gov.uk and I will forward on to the relevant person. Finally, Chris McDonald has visited the area and has agreed to write to the landowner as a matter of urgency as well as pressing the case with Amazon directly too.

Giant Hogweed

Just as an advisory note to residents, we were notified that some Giant Hogweed had been spotted growing in one of the Charles Church building compounds. We made contact with their customer service team, who advised that the area is being treated by a specialist contractor, and that they're fully aware of the seriousness and the urgency of this matter. Whilst the area in question has been fenced off and is inaccessible to the public, we'd like to remind parents and pet owners especially that contact with this plant can cause immediate and very painful blistering, so please be vigilant when walking in the development.

Stagecoach

Our next meeting with Stagecoach's Commercial team is scheduled for 20th August. The key topic that we'll be continuing to discuss is the possibility of extending the existing bus routes to cover Sedgefield and Teesside Park, which are both destinations regarding which we regularly receive comments from residents. We're also aware that a resident petition has been circulated on this topic too. We will be pressing the case very strongly for both of these destinations and will provide a further update in due course.

Youth Council

After a lot of effort from Councillor Val Bailey particularly over the last couple of years, we're delighted to share that the Youth Council will be officially launching in September, with its first meeting at Wynyard Hall. The Youth Council will meet prior to each full Council Meeting. This is a brilliant opportunity for our Youth Councillors to see how Council works, develop their confidence and public speaking as well as being the voice of younger residents when it comes to the infrastructure and facilities needed for different age groups across Wynyard. Both local MPs are fully supportive of this initiative too and have offered to take our Youth Councillors on a tour of the Houses of Parliament. Specific Youth Council updates will appear in future issues of Wynyard Matters from the next issue onwards.



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Wynyard Parish Council (Hartlepool) Update

Tree Preservation Order (TPO)

As previously reported in the summer edition of Wynyard Matters, the tree clearance undertaken earlier this year on land behind the Meadows was thankfully halted following the intervention by the Hartlepool Arboricultural Officer by the issuing of a TPO which covers a significant area of the remaining woodland on Wynyard Park.

Whilst Wynyard Park had the appropriate licences in place at the time, allowing the clearing of plantation trees, it has nonetheless devastated a significant area of woodland that is regularly enjoyed by residents and is a habitat for wildlife. Wynyard Park and others submitted objections to Hartlepool Borough Council; the Planning Committee was due to consider the appeal at its meeting on 12th August 2026, but it has subsequently been deferred until 9th September 2026.

The Parish Council, along with a significant number of residents, wrote to the HBC officer to demonstrate their support for retaining the TPO and will make verbal representation to the Planning Committee. We, along with concerned residents, trust that by the time you are reading this, common sense will have prevailed and the remaining woodland hopefully will be protected for residents and wildlife to access now and in the future.

Joint Working

Both Parish Councils (Hartlepool & Stockton) continue to work positively together on behalf of all Wynyard residents on campaigns including 'Education for Wynyard', A689 Safe Crossing and the most recent topic of 'the Local Plan'.

Councillors regularly attend each other's Parish Council meetings and the Wynyard Residents Association meetings to provide updates on issues across the Wynyard Community. Whilst some residents may find it hard to understand why we have two Parish Councils - this is purely because Wynyard cuts across two Local Authorities - Hartlepool & Stockton and are required by law to have individual Parish Councils who are responsible to their respective Local Authorities.

Each Parish Council is required to hold its own public meetings, making representation when and where appropriate on matters such as planning, services and amenities for the local community, meeting with landowners such as Wynyard Park and Wynyard Estates to report on maintenance issues across the estates and seek improvements where possible.

We are pleased to update residents that we have been notified that the 2nd Primary School (St Joseph's Wynyard Park) will be a two-form entry. However, at this point in time, we do not have any details on when construction will commence or a planned opening date. As highlighted above, a number of issues such as Education (both Primary and Secondary provision) and the development of a Local Plan for Wynyard are of concern for both Parish Councils, which logically requires a unified approach - then Sub Groups have been established which allow for meaningful discussion, not only between Councillors but also with concerned residents with the aim of drafting proposals that can be formally presented at Parish Council meetings and if agreed progressed with their respective Local Authorities.

Both Parish Councils also work positively with their local MPs, seeking to gain their joint support in representing Wynyard residents' concerns. The most recent meeting, held on 3rd July, focused on the requirement for a safe crossing at the East gate roundabout on the A689. They have agreed to push for a joint meeting with Stockton and Hartlepool Borough Councils and the Tees Valley Combined Authority to ascertain the root causes of the delay and, hopefully, provide a timeframe for when work will start/complete.

New Councillor Co-opted

Following the recent local elections held in May 2026, the Parish Council was left with one vacant post. Following our July meeting, Nicola Rowe was nominated and duly co-opted to fill this vacancy. Nicola, being originally from the North East, has returned to the area and is keen to be involved in community life in Wynyard. She will take up this post in August and is joining a proactive team of individuals on the Parish Council who continue to work hard to represent residents, seek improvements in services and amenities across Wynyard, and retain the character of the area.

SPICED TOFFEE APPLE CAKE

Ingredients

- 200g dates roughly chopped
- 200ml milk plus a splash
- 250g butter softened, plus extra for greasing
- 280g self-raising flour
- 200g light soft brown sugar
- ½ tsp baking powder
- 4 large eggs



Method

Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Grease and line a 20 x 30cm baking tray with baking parchment. Put the dates and milk in a small pan and bring to a simmer. Remove from the heat and set aside for 15 mins to cool.

Whizz the date mixture to a smooth purée in a food processor or blender, then scrape into a large mixing bowl. Tip in the butter, flour, brown sugar, baking powder, eggs, mixed spice and vanilla, and set aside while you prepare the apples.

Quarter and core the apples, then slice quite thinly, tossing in a little lemon juice as you go. Quickly beat together the cake ingredients with an electric whisk until smooth, then scrape into the baking tray. Arrange the apple slices, overlapping in rows, on top of the cake – you should be able to get 3 rows lengthways down the tray. Bake for 45-50 mins until a skewer poked into the centre of the cake comes out clean. Cool in the tray.

Put the toffees in a small pan with a good splash of milk and gently melt, stirring, until runny. To finish, dust with a little icing sugar, then drizzle sauce all over the cake. Cut into squares or slices to serve.

That is why the involvement of residents in developing community activities is so important. The various groups don't just create activities for community interaction but also try to put safeguards in place to ensure that the quality of life on Wynyard is not eroded.

The fantastic work of all of the groups was best illustrated in the Family Fun Day, organised by the Events team, that saw record numbers of families attending. But equally important is the work of Paul Redfearn and Bob Scott, of the Neighbourhood Watch Team, who have built closer links with our local policing representatives to monitor crime across the Stockton area of Wynyard and mirroring the excellent work done by the Hartlepool team.

Louise Devlin has been instrumental in the improvement of the road surfaces along The Wynd and is looking into the need for improved signage.

The 'Book Hut' clientele continues to grow, and it is so gratifying to receive the positive comments about how much the facility is appreciated.

The phenomenal growth of the Events Team reflects the awareness of Wynyard's recognition of the needs of others and the wonderful fund-raising that has been linked to the events with, in the last year, thousands of pounds being donated to worthy causes and local charitable groups.

Despite these contributions, the WRA accounts are in a very strong position, due almost entirely to the funds raised from the brilliant Wynyard Matters Magazine and the work of Caroline Bennett.

The monthly meetings are quite well attended, perhaps because they involve dynamic discussion about matters that are important to residents. We never have too many residents offering ideas for improving Wynyard, from the provision of benches in key spots to concerns about planning matters. Long may that continue.

WRAAG - WYNYARD RESIDENTS ASSOCIATION ACTION GROUP

The Local Plan

At the July WRA meeting, resident John Richardson provided residents with an update on the formerly delayed, but now initiated, strategy for the creation of Stockton's 'Local Plan'. The development will have a significant impact on Wynyard, as will the 'Local Plan' for Hartlepool which will be introduced in the near future.

John emphasised the importance of community involvement in the development of the Stockton 'Local Plan' as it would be used to identify areas of development, across the whole of Stockton, for housing, industrial development, land for education, health, leisure, green space and the associated highways infrastructure that would be needed. This will have a major impact on Wynyard's future development.

He explained that a recent SBC council meeting set out a suggested timetable for developing the Plan that provides several opportunities for consultation before its implementation in 2029. The first opportunity to engage will be inputting to the consultation in the "scoping" of the Plan, which will begin in October 2026.

JR explained that it was vital that Wynyard had representatives, particularly through the parish councils and local Members of Parliament and had a "seat at the table" when plans were being formulated. Keith Malcolm, chair of Wynyard Parish Council (Hartlepool) agreed that a united approach was essential.

JR also suggested that the existing timeframe and the likely impact on the whole Wynyard community was of such importance and significance that a SPECIAL MEETING should be arranged, for all residents, to raise awareness of the matter.

This was unanimously supported by residents in attendance.

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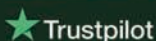

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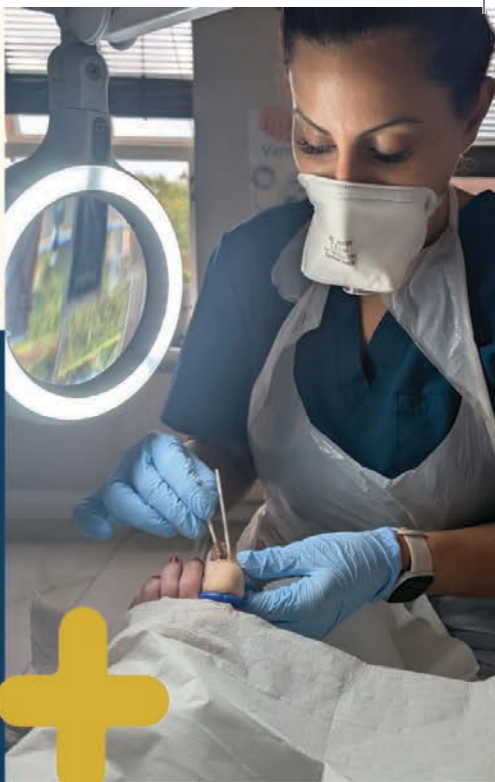
